



Pediatric Trauma Program Manager The Children's Hospital - Colorado

Trauma Program Manager ("TPM") sought for Level I / Regional Pediatric Trauma Center ("RPTC"). The Children's Hospital located in the Denver metro area is the only RPTC in the state of Colorado and a major trauma referral center for the Rocky Mountain region with approximately 1,200 pediatric trauma/burn admissions per year. The TPM collaborates with the physician director and the trauma program performance committee to coordinate multi-disciplinary resources for the care of injured children and their families.

Major task areas include but are not limited to:

- Clinical Activities-coordinate management across the continuum of trauma care
- Educational Responsibilities-provide for interfaculty and regional professional staff development
- Performance Improvement-monitor clinical processes, outcomes and system issues related to the quality of care provided
- Administration-manage, as appropriate, the operational, personnel and financial aspects of the trauma program
- Supervision of the Trauma Registry-supervise collection, coding, scoring and validation of trauma/burn data
- Consultant and Liaison-manage the network of disciplines that work in concert to provide optimal pediatric trauma/burn care
- Research-be involved in research projects, analysis and dissemination of results
- Community and National Involvement in Trauma Care Systems-participate in the development of trauma care systems at the community, state and national levels

The ideal candidate for this position will have leadership and management experience in the provision of pediatric trauma and critical care, with clinical experience in trauma or emergency medicine required. Clinical experience in Level I trauma center or RPTC preferred. Previous experience in healthcare planning, business management and/or systems development required. The TPM must be proficient in oral and written communication and able to collaborate effectively as a team leader. Problem solving, team work, consensus building, and negotiation skills are necessary. Knowledge of research methodology is important, along with ability to extrapolate and apply current principles in the art and science of nursing to the practice of nursing.

Graduate of an accredited school of nursing with a bachelor's degree in nursing (with active CO license) preferred. Master's degree in nursing, administration or related field preferred.
